

2011 CB66 Nordic League and 2011 CB66 Nordic Championship



Rules

2011 CB66 NORDIC LEAGUE

The 2011 CB66 Nordic League is designed to attract all CB66 sailors in Northern Europe by joining all teams in a series of regattas. Venues have been selected to offer the best combination of competition, atmosphere and social activities.

The winner of the league is the team who has performed the most consistent over the five stages and will be crowned 2011 CB66 League Winner at the Galla Party on Café Opera in Stockholm at the League Final.

STAGES

The following events will count towards the overall 2011 CB66 Nordic League

TEAMS PARTICIPATING

All CB66 teams are invited to participate in the 2011 CB66 Nordic League.

Teams participating in the 2011 CB66 Nordic League should be named at the season opening, and is defined by the sail number and primary helmsman / skipper. One secondary helmsman may be included in the team during the season.

Crew may be exchanged during the season but not during a stage (Normal ISAF rules for crew substitution applies).

The helmsman steering the boat at the league finale in Stockholm must have helmed the boat at minimum 2 of the first 4 stages in order for the team to be able to count scores from stage 1-4 going in to the league finale.

RULES

All stages will be governed by the International Rules of Sailing combined with national applicable rules.

All boats and crews eligible to compete in the 2011 CB66 Nordic League must comply with the CB66 Class Rules at all times during sailing

SCORING

The final result of each stage will count towards the total score in the league.

The winner of a stage will be awarded 1 point, 2nd 2 points and so forth to the league scoring. Boats not participating in a stage will be awarded points equal to the total number of participants in that stage plus 1.

One stage-discard will be given towards the total league score, however the score from League Finale in Stockholm cannot be discarded. Ties are resolved using ISAF standard procedures for breaking ties.

2011 CB66 NORDIC CHAMPIONSHIP

The 6 best placed boats in the 2011 CB66 Nordic League will qualify for the 2011 CB66 Nordic Championship. The championship will be decided over a series of 3 short races sailed immediately after completion of the final league stage races in Stockholm on Saturday.

All 6 teams will enter the championship ship with zero points and scoring in the championship races will be according to the low point system.

No part of the team should be changed between league final stage and the championship races.

FAIR PLAY

The CB66 class intends to promote fair sailing.

A special Fair Play prize will be given to the team who offers the greatest display of sportsmanship during the league stages. Nominations are done by the individual participants, and the team who receives the most nominations through the season will be awarded the Fair Play prize at the League Finale in Stockholm.

SPONSOR

Participants in the 2011 CB66 Nordic League may be required to carry sponsor logos in sails or on the hulls.

Other measures to ensure spectator friendliness may apply. This may include the requirement to use a special genacker to indicate current ranking of the team in the league.
